1. Open to all members of the Ontario Horticultural Association.
2. Each member is allowed to submit only one entry in each class
3. Exhibitors are requested to **pre-register**, stating class number and **size** of work
4. Name of the artist should be covered.
5. All classes **MUST** have a horticultural theme.
6. Entries should not exceed 122cm (48") in any direction.
7. Classes 1 - 6 **MUST BE FRAMED** and equipped with strong fittings for hanging.
8. **Each entry MUST have an entry tag**, giving name, address, (use a return address label) and society's name and District. Entry tags will be supplied by the Ontario Horticultural Association, or by exhibitor.
9. All works must be received between 7:00pm – 9:00pm Thursday, August 21st or **PRIOR to 9:00 AM on Friday, August 22, 2008**.
10. All works must be original, completed in the last **five years** and not previously exhibited in the Ontario Horticultural Association Art Show.
11. Ribbons and prize money awarded will be given at the convention.
12. Ontario Horticultural Association is not responsible for damage or loss to exhibits.
13. All entries must be removed between noon and 2:00 pm on **August 24, 2008**.
14. All winning entries will be photographed for possible posting on gardenontario.org
15. When registering please indicate if you are interested in selling your painting.
16. **To grant permission or refusal of permission** to post a picture of your painting, fill out permission form and submit form at the time of registration for the competition.

CLASS 1. **"Your Neighbourhood"** - any medium - framed.

CLASS 2. **"Four Seasons"** a collage – any medium - framed.

CLASS 3. **"Lilies, a collection"** – any medium - framed.

CLASS 4. **"Remember When - An English Country Churchyard"** – watercolor - framed.

CLASS 5. **"Spring Song - the first flowers"** – any medium - framed.

CLASS 6. **"Snow Fell this Morning"** - dried, seeds or pressed materials - framed.

CLASS 7. **"Pretty Faces"** - acrylic or oil on "gallery" canvas 16" x 16" NOT FRAMED

CLASS 8. **"Forever Flowers"** - flowers painted on a large stone to "plant" in the garden max size 12" L x 12" W x 12"H

CLASS 9. **"Roots in the Past"**- Hypertufa object only, not planted, maximum size 18" in any dimension

CLASS 10. **"Sharing our Diversity"** - quilted wall hanging. Perimeter not to exceed 76cm (30") X 91cm (36") height.

Class A - Hand quilted

Class B - Sewing machine quilted
