RULES and REGULATIONS:

1. Open to all members of the Ontario Horticultural Association and Affiliates.
2. Each member is allowed to submit only one entry in each class. All artworks *must* be pre-registered with the Chairperson noted above by August 6, 2010.
3. Name of the artist should be covered for judging.
4. All classes must have a horticultural theme.
5. Entries should not exceed 36" in any direction including framing.
6. All artwork must be mounted in a way suitable for hanging to insure that the artwork is undamaged during display. This means that any artwork created on paper should be matted, and covered with glass or plexiglass and held securely with a frame or clips. Artwork on canvas or board can be either framed or unframed. All artwork must also have a suitable hanging system installed on the back.
7. **Each entry must have an entry tag**, giving name, address, (use a return address label) and society's name and District. Entry tags will be supplied by the Ontario Horticultural Association.
8. All works must be received and registered on site between 8:00 pm and 10:00 pm Thursday, August 12th or *prior to 9:00 am on Friday, August 13, 2010*.
9. All works must be original, completed in the last *five years*, and not previously exhibited in the Ontario Horticultural Association Art Competition.
10. Ribbons and prize money awarded will be given at the convention.
11. Reasonable security will be supplied for exhibitors' property, however, the Ontario Horticultural Association assumes no responsibility for loss or damage.
12. All entries must be removed between 5:00-6:30 pm August 14 or 7:30-9:00 am August 15, 2010.
13. All winning entries will be photographed for possible posting on gardenontario.org.
14. When registering, please indicate if you are interested in selling your painting. Business cards may be added *after* judging is complete, write price on *back* of business card.
15. **To grant permission or refusal of permission** to post a picture of your painting, fill out permission form and submit form at the time of registration for the competition.

Class 1. **"Everything Old Is New Again"** – Flower(s) that were popular in the past and have come into style again, pencil, coloured pencil or charcoal drawing.

Class 2. **"Gone to Seed"** – seed picture; framed, free standing, suitable for a desk.

Class 3. **"Recovered Logs"** – A sculpture not to exceed 18" in any direction, including found or recycled wood.

Class 4. **"Blowing in the Wind"** - New! Fabric art, max 24"x36" banner, wind sock, kite, decorated with Horticultural motif, suitable for hanging outside.

Class 5. **"The Power of Water"** – a landscape with focus on water, i.e., lake, river, waterfall, etc., done in watercolours.

Class 6. **"The Wonder of Leaves"** - an acrylic painting, unframed.

Class 7. **"Urban Growth"** – a collage – an abstract design, created by gluing plant materials and usually other objects on a flat surface. The collage is done in low relief (2"). Depth is implied and achieved by overlapping glued materials. Painted medium may be incorporated. There should be no spaces between the panel and the materials. (Page 93, Ontario Judging and Exhibiting Standards.)

Class 8: **"The Bounties of Nature"** – A vegetable still life painted in oil or acrylic, framed

Class 9: **"Touch of Glass"** – stained-glass sun-catcher or mandella with horticultural design. Must be ready to hang.

Prizes: First \$10.00 Second \$8.00 Third \$6.00 Best in Show – Ribbon only.
